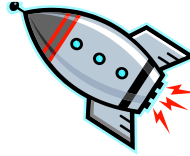




Year 1 Maths



Step 1

✎ I can count on and back in ones from any number (up to 20).

✎ I can compare two numbers and say which is bigger or smaller up to 30.

✎ I can read and write the numbers up to 10 with the correct formation.

✎ I can recite the days of the week and use 'yesterday', 'tomorrow' and 'today'.

These are a selection of the targets children will be working on in their school work at this level. Please note that these are just a sample and there are a range of other skills we teach the children before we move them to the next stage.

Step 2

✎ I can say the number that is one more or one less than any number up to 30.

✎ I can read and write numbers up to 50 with correct formation.

✎ I can count in ones and tens up to 100.

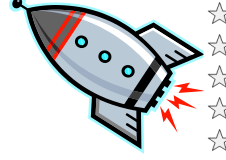
✎ I know by heart all the pairs of numbers that total 10.

✎ I can recognise and name the coins from 1p to £2.

Step 3

- ✎ I can count on and back in ones and tens from 0 to 100.
- ✎ I can read and write numbers to 100.
- ✎ I know by heart all pairs of numbers that total 20.
- ✎ I can double numbers up to 10+10 and halve even numbers up to 20.
- ✎ I can recognise and read o'clock and half past times on an analogue clock (a clock with hands).
